# Fulbright-France Postgraduate Student Award in Law at the University of Pennsylvania Law School

The University of Pennsylvania Law School's **General Master of Laws (LL.M.)** Law Program has partnered with Fulbright France to offer a **\$25 000** grant for eligible students to pursue the LL.M. degree at Penn Law.

<b>ELIGIBILITY</b>	<p>Eligible students must be a citizen of France, and must hold a first degree in law from a foreign (non-U.S.) jurisdiction.</p> <p>Dual Franco-American citizens are not eligible. Candidates already residing or studying in the United States are not eligible.</p>
<b>PROGRAM</b>	<p>The University of Pennsylvania Law School's generalized LL.M. will allow the award recipient to design their own curriculum and, in doing so, to choose to focus on a particular topic. In addition, they will be able to participate in the a wide range of programs, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Wharton Business and Law Certificate (WBLC):</b> This is a custom designed program for Penn Law LL.M. students taught by Wharton faculty and industry experts selected. All scholarship recipients are eligible for the WBLC, but there is additional tuition required that is not covered by the scholarship.</li> <li>• <b>LL.M. Public Service Program:</b> Penn Law provides students with important opportunities to develop their professional skills while learning more about the communities that exist beyond the walls of Penn Law.</li> <li>• <b>Clinical Programs:</b> Award recipients will be eligible to participate in clinical programs available to LL.Ms, which have focused on Entrepreneurship, Intellectual Property and Technology, International Human Rights and Immigration, and Mediation.</li> </ul>
<b>CAMPUS</b>	<p>Penn Law's campus is state-of-the-art and students are steps away from the amenities of the University of Pennsylvania. Philadelphia is one of the most historic cities in the United States and offers professional students an affordable, accessible, and exciting lifestyle with easy access to New York and Washington, DC.</p>
<b>GRANT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• \$25,000 from the <a href="http://www.upenn.edu/law">University of Pennsylvania Law School</a> (Penn Law's grant is contingent on accepting Fulbright status).</li> <li>• Fulbright will offer the successful candidate Fulbright status, including: a travel stipend of 1,200€, health coverage, J-1 visa sponsorship, and access to global Fulbright programming in France and the United States.</li> <li>• A Fulbright maintenance grant may also be offered depending on overall Fulbright ranking.</li> </ul>
