Major Ulrich currently serves as a Professor in the National Security Law Department at the Judge Advocate General's School in Charlottesville, Virginia. He teaches a portfolio that includes the Means and Methods of Warfare, Artificial Intelligence and Lethal Autonomous Weapons Systems, Emergent Technologies Implemented on the Battlefield, Advanced National Security Law, and Advanced Law of Armed Conflict to U.S. and international students, including military and civilian attorneys from all military services, the Department of Defense, and other governmental agencies, as well as senior military commanders.

Major Ulrich attended Rutgers University in New Brunswick, New Jersey. He earned a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice in 2004. After completing his undergraduate study, Major Ulrich attended law school at New England Law – Boston in Boston, Massachusetts. Major Ulrich entered the Judge Advocate General's Corps in February of 2010. In 2019, he received an LL.M. in Military Law with a National Security Law emphasis from the Judge Advocate General's School.

Major Ulrich's previous military assignments include: Battalion Judge Advocate, 4th Battalion, 1st Special Forces Group (Airborne), Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington and Legal Advisor, Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force, Syria, 2017; Chief of Operational Law, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas, and Combined Joint Task Force-One, Afghanistan, 2012-2015; Trial Counsel and Special Assistant United States Attorney, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, 2010-2012.

Major Ulrich is a graduate of the 67th Judge Advocate Graduate Course and the 181st Judge Advocate Officer Basic Course. His awards and decorations include the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with two campaign stars, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, NATO Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Ribbon, and Army Service Ribbon. Major Ulrich is also authorized to wear the Basic Parachutist Badge.

Major Ulrich is a member of the Bar of New York, New Jersey, the United States Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces, and the United States Army Court of Criminal Appeals. He is married and has two sons.
