The OGC externship program, which has been in existence for many years, allows students to work closely with attorneys in OGC, and to become involved in a broad range of legal issues. In order to apply, please submit a resume, writing sample, transcript and a brief statement of interest addressed to Mark Feingold, Esq. in one PDF via email to **externships@law.upenn.edu** with OGC in the subject line by **5 PM, May 10, 2021**. The externship is for 4 credits (requiring approximately 12 hours per week). All students will be notified of their application status before the end of Fall Advance Registration so that they can make other course selections if not selected for enrollment.
