Results are calculated using the evaluation responses for all Seminar courses. Each response has equal weight, so courses with more enrolled students have a greater effect on the results than courses with fewer students.

Results are calculated by first calculating a result for each Seminar course and then equally weighting each of those results together to form the final result. This means that each course has equal weight in the results.
